Dennis Hamilton retiring after 30 years at the helm of Red Demon Basketball

After thirty years of teaching and coaching basketball at Dodge City High School, Dennis Hamilton is retiring. Hamilton is stepping aside from his duties as both a PE Teacher and Head Basketball Coach at the end of the current school year. He will do so as the winningest Head Basketball coach in the 112 year history of Red Demon basketball.

J.C. Riekenberg hired Dennis Hamilton as the Head Boys Basketball Coach in the summer of 1987. Hamilton, a 1976 graduate of DCHS, was the head coach at Bishop Kelley High School in Tulsa, OK before returning to

his alma mater. His first team at Dodge City finished (19-4), complete with a WAC Championship and the first trip to State for the Red Demons in seven years. Hamilton would lead the Red Demons to (13) State Basketball Tournaments over the course of his career at DCHS. He would also coach his teams to (8) WAC titles, including four in a row from 2010-2013. His career record at DCHS was (418-251) – 258 more wins than second place on the list, Laurence Stanton.

At the 2004 6A State Tournament in Emporia, the Red Demons played for a State Title versus Olathe South – finishing the season as State Runner-Ups with a record of (22-3). The Red Demons reached the Final Four of the State Tournament six times with Hamilton as the Head Coach, an accomplishment the program had only reached twice before 1987.

Dennis Hamilton will forever be respected for his accomplishments as the leader of the Red Demon Basketball program. However, his influence at Dodge High cannot be measured just in wins and titles. Coach Hamilton's success and longevity were always grounded in his belief that he was developing players by making them better young men along the way. His focus was on the character of the players he coached, and not just on their abilities as basketball players.

One of Coach Hamilton's greatest joys was coaching his three sons – Tyler, Jordan, and Ben. Ben is a current Red Demon assistant for his father. His wife, Tawnya, rarely missed a game over the past thirty years – as Red Demon Basketball was certainly a family affair for the Hamilton's.

The search for a new Head Coach will begin immediately. The DCHS Athletic Department will place a priority on hiring a certified teacher who has the necessary expertise and experience to lead the Red Demon basketball program and continue the tradition built by Coach Hamilton.
